'I would ditch church and go to the drags'

The first week of March, I was in Tecate, Mex., building a church with Point Loma Nazarene University. For the last 10 years, I have been going on these trips to wherever there is a need in Baja. We take 30 staff and students every Spring Break. This trip draws the best students, who not only spend their Spring Break in Mexico doing manual labor but also pay \$300. These are special students!

When we arrive on Sunday, the 30'x 40'cement slab is already poured. Monday through Friday, the schedule is the same: 8am breakfast, work, 1pm lunch, work, 6pm dinner, sleep. And repeat.

The walls are made from a unique "Lego" type design of polystyrene insulated concrete forms. The wall systems for the buildings comprise polystyrene foam blocks, concrete, and steel rebar in every cell of the block. Then we build wood trusses onsite and install a corrugated roof by the end of the week. It is really a great time of working along with students, staff and even the university president, who really gets in there and works. Because the construction is so simple, we can get the building sealed in by the time we leave the following Saturday.

Before the trip, I was talking to Bob Martello about the project in in Tecate. He said there used to be a drag strip in the town. Drag racing was born in post-war Southern California, Milton took

as many of you know. From dreams filled with endless sunny skies, fast cars and the American can-do spirit, young racers were not only living the California dream, but they also lived by naval and air stations, which fueled their motivation for cars. With speed and ingenuity in the water and the air, they were inspired and spurred on to innovate through their cars. Thus, drag racing was born.

So, I started inquiring about where the track was. The pastor said

he "knew where it was" and promised to take me to the track. Saturday morning came, and we got in the car. We drove about 20 minutes from the northside of town, past the brewery, through a canyon and onto a dirt road. There it was, the Tecate Drag Strip. There hadn't been rac-

ing there since the 90s, and it really showed. The starting line was still there, with it's cement pad. The steel barriers and the decapitated tower framing were there, with the faded Tecate logo. Houses had popped up around the track, and the asphalt lanes were nonexistent. This track had gone the way of so many other tracks, too many to count.

Many of you have experienced this devolution of the local drag racing

Senses overload, but what a blast!

For longtime Moparites, MATS always meant Mopars at the Strip: a high-powered all-Mopar long weekend of racing, showing, swapping, live concerts and maybe running into some of racing's greatest. So it's still hard for some to accept that this annual three-day event in Las Vegas is now known as Muscle Cars at the Strip, still all of the above, but with more than Mopars in the mix.

However, it's a little easier to adjust to that when a Mopar – and one owned by a Mopar Club San Diego member – won this year's "Overall Excellence" award, and another member almost won the AFX Class after winning the first race – if an oil issue hadn't sidelined the car.

Among Mopar Club SD members in Las Vegas for MATS this year were Milton Karahadian, Marv Reiser, Bob

Martello, Woody Widman, Roy Stinson, Kathy Silcott, Kay and Jim Signorelli, and Lee DeTro and Marie Roecker (plus former member Lee Meyer): some there to race, some to show, some to just take it all in.

MATS can be senses overload! Hundreds of impressive muscle cars (still mostly *Mopars*); just about anything auto you'd like to buy, be it rusted, refurbed classic or brand new; and anything BUT

the sounds of silence.

Garnering the 2024 "Overall Excellence" honors, awarded by "Hemmings Motor News," was Mopar Club SD President Milton Karahadian's 1965 Chrysler 300L convertible with its 413 that features a recently installed dual-quad conversion, and its still-stunning paint, interior and top, all restored in 2019.

Milton's Chrysler is a one-family car, first owned by his Uncle Alfred until his death at age 95. Milton has had it ever since-and it's a driver!

Club member Mary Reiser, racing in the AFX Class in his '65 Dodge Coronet (below) with its 540 cubic inch all-aluminum Indy cylinder head engine, won the first round of elimination before an oil issue sidelined his Coronet prior to the second and final round. Marv is consoled

by knowing that the top four cars in the class were Mopars, and "the class was won by a young lady piloting a Hemipowered '67 Dodge Dart." That final race was run about 11:30pm Sunday. "A very long day, for sure," he says.

A side note: Mary's car has a best time of 9.7 ET at 142.2mph; however, not at this year's MATS.

Kathy Silcott was the only known newbie from the club attending MATS 2024, and her first out-of-state national three-day event exceeded all expectations. "Wow! It was so exciting to be at such a huge first-class racing facility. It was wellorganized; everyone was so friendly." And she was fortunate to be able to meet some of racing's greats.

Kathy caravaned to MATS in her 2021 Challenger Hellcat Redeve, fol-

lowing Kay and Jim Signorelli in their 2015 Challenger Hellcat, stopping, of course, at Peggy Sue's Diner, a nostalgic step back to the 50s-60s for familiar comfort food, all sorts of memorabilia. iconic and sometimes forgotten candies, posters of legendary idols of the era, and

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more. "A cool place all it's own!" she savs.

MATS literally is a gas for anyone, but especially eye-opening for a newbie: high-volumn and high-powered drag racing all day each day and into night, its massive midway of vendors and food trucks, the expansive swap meet of vehicle parts and more, show cars galore and the opportunity to meet some of the best of the racing world of yesteryear.

On Sunday morning, the final day of racing, our own Chaplain Milton Karahadian led the non-denominational service at the track, hosted by Team RFC-Racers for Christ, and which Kathy, Jim and others attended.

During the three-day event, Kathy, Jim and Lee (DeTro) crossed paths with some renowned drivers and iconic cars. with many photos to memorialize the meet-ups. Among those was Paul Rossi, who is in the Drag Racing Hall of Fame and is known as "the granddaddy of natural gas racing" and for partnering with Carroll Shelby to build a drag-racing program.

Rossi also raced at IMSA with Chrysler, was a four-time winner at Pike's Peak and at one time consulted with Lee Iacocca at Chrysler. Rossi's original Direct Connection Super Stock Challenger definitely was legendary. At MATS, this year, he had the #2 Direct Connection 440 Six-Pack Super Stock Challenger on display and signed copies of the edition of "Chrysler Power" magazine that featured him on the cover and his story inside. (Milton has invited Rossi to be a speaker at one of our club meetings)


The trio also met Arnie Klann, who owns the 1971 Motown Missile Challenger Pro-Stock and the 1975 Motown Missile Duster Pro-Stock "wire car" (both driven back in the day by Don Carlton). Both cars, built with some of the most advanced technology and materials of their time, remain fully operational. Klann invited Kathy and Jim to sit in the Motown Missile Challenger's driver's seat-and, of course they did.

Kathy, Lee and Jim also connected with Kenny Youngblood, renowned for

Youngblood also has teamed up with Team RFC-Racers for Christ and has recently published a book on relationships.

After her first-timer's experience at MATS 2024, Kathy is oh, so ready to repeat. "This was awesome to be involved at so many different levels! 

Stellantis is recalling 285,000 Chargers, 300s because side curtain airbag inflators could break open

CNN — Stellantis is recalling almost 285,000 Dodge Charger and Chrysler 300 sedans in the United States because they have side curtain airbag inflators that could burst, sending metal shrapnel flying through the cabin.

Airbag inflators rely on a chemical reaction that produces gas that rapidly inflates the airbag. Moisture may have gotten inside inflators installed in some 2018 through 2021 Charger and 300 models in the manufacturing process. That water could lead to internal corrosion and, possibly, cracks in the inflator, according to documents Stellantis filed with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The Charger and 300 are large sedans that share most of their engineering. The airbag inflators involved in this recall were not installed in any other Stellantis models, according to the documents.

While the situation is similar to that which led to the recall of millions of Takata airbag inflators used in many different vehicles, this problem is apparently

Beginning in early May, Stellantis will mail letters to Charger and 300 owners with cars that could have the problem. Owners will be instructed to bring their cars into a dealership to have the side airbags on both sides of the vehicles replaced.

The work will be done at no charge to owners, and people who may already have had their side curtain airbags replaced will be reimbursed for the cost.

Stellantis is not aware of any accidents or injuries resulting from these issues. There were five known instances in which the airbag inflators burst. In each case, they were in parked vehicles in which the interior temperature reached over 120 degrees, which it can, especially in hot weather.

One-of-a-kind Mopar "glamour car" comes out of hiding

The car, which has been totally restored, is a one-only "Dukes" General Lee for far too many reasons to detail here, but among other custom touches, it has all the trim and bumpers powder-coated gloss black, it's powered by a 440 crate motor and has a custom interior. And . . . it has an airbrushed mural and autographs of "Dukes" cast members on the inside of its trunk lid: a definite car show-stopper.

It has all its documentation and only 19,000 documented miles. Anyone interested in every detail of this unique car, which is being offered for \$115,000, can visit classiccarmarketing.net and click on "new arrivals"
