The history of the Chrysler Pentastar

Reprinted from the Daytona-Superbird Auto club newsletter, summer 2025 issue.

In the summer of 1962, Chrysler was preparing to unveil its brand new corporate logo.

The design's creator, Robert Stanley, knew from experience that it was important to give the emblem a name.

Stanley, then employed by an industrial design and marketing firm working with Chrysler, had earlier designed a red-circle logo for another industrial firm. That red circle became known as "the meatball," Stanley recalled. "Unless you provide a name for what you do, people inside and

outside the corporation attach a name to it that can be less than desirable."

In a phone conversation with then Chrysler advertising director Dick Forbes, Stanley, off the top of his head, came up with the name "Pentastar." The name stuck and decades later, so has Stanley's creation.

Stanley, who went on to form his own consulting firm in metro Detroit, was invited to the dedication ceremonies at Chrysler's Auburn Hills headquarters when it opened in 1996 and topped with a two story glass Pentastar.

Stanley created the insignia as Detroit office vice president and account executive for the New York-based firm of Lippincott & Margulies, Inc. There was no significance to choosing five as the emblem's theme. He wanted the emblem to not be too com-

plicated and still have a very strong engineered look to it. Stanley recalled, "We wanted something that people could look at and say, 'This was not done freehand.' That is why the triangles are not joined at the points. There is a certain amount of tension there."

Stanley's design was among some 800 suggestions that he and other members of his team had done. They had to avoid an oval shape—Ford already had that—and anything that depended on words. The company wanted no confusion between the corporation and its Chrysler brand. With the corporation expanding into foreign markets, it also was



important to have a symbol that could be recognized in any language.

Chrysler's previous mark had been the Forward Look, which resembled two overlapping sideways V's. But as the Forward Look in cars became dated, so did the mark. For that reason, it had fallen out of use by the early 1960s. "It reached a point where the company didn't put the Chrysler ID on new products," Stanley said. The Plymouth Valiant and Dodge Dart had no reference to Chrysler Corporation in their advertising.

Then new Chrysler

President Lynn Townsend brought in Lippincott & Margulies to establish a strong corporate identity with a corporate mark and identity program. "A mark could be produced by just about anybody," Stanley said. "But that wasn't going to solve the basic problem to identify the brand and product with the corporation."

From 1962 to 1965, Stanley and his team conducted 234 individual corporate identity projects for Chrysler. Those included establishing standards for the Corporate Identity Office, headed by F.E Cogsdill, and for rolling out the Chrysler mark at dealerships and designing Chrysler brand logotypes.

As the Pentastar was implemented in 1963. Dealers were sent medallion kits with hardware to install on the passenger side fenders of existing cars, near the bottom, where it would be visible from the curb.

After falling out of favor in the 1980s, a revised Pentastar was lightly redesigned by Trevor Creed in 2007, during the Daimler-Chrysler era. The Pentastar was retired in 2014 with little fanfare after the merger with Fiat.

Although the Pentastar Stanley created became one of the most famous corporate symbols, he said, "I've never been in the business of designing marks. I'm interested in designing and developing programs of corporate identity. Sometimes, designing marks is part of it."




