When word got out that NASCAR was coming to town over a year ago, the excitement began to build. I was asked to serve on the leadership team representing Mopar Club SD, along with J Bittle and JBA, to help plan the event. There were so many great ideas and exciting possibilities for the car club community.

One of the highlights was going to be a display of nostalgic stock cars under a large tent, complete with food and an open bar for those wearing wristbands. As many of you know, I invited J to come to one of our club meetings to help promote the event. We were all looking forward to what promised to be an incredible weekend.

But little by little, the plans began to unravel. The car show was canceled because of the conflict in the Middle East, as the Navy determined it couldn't provide the additional security needed for the event. Then NASCAR's preferred catering vendor required that they be the only food provider inside the tent. Unfortunately, their pricing made it unaffordable for the average car club member, and there was no flexibility. J had been willing to provide hot dogs and hamburgers, create a fun atmosphere, market the event, offer t-shirts, and even promote memberships to his Last Speed Shop. Sadly, that all fell apart in the end.

That brings me to my "non-seat."

Using the website provided by JBA, I reserved four General Admission tickets along with a set of racing headsets. I invited my father-in-law, his girlfriend, and Chavonne, thinking it would be a memorable day together.

We took the ferry over that morning and made the nearly two-mile walk through the gate to the general admission

area. When I looked at our tickets to find our seat numbers...there weren't any.

Our ticket classification was BP5, which basically meant, "You don't have a seat. Hopefully you brought your own chair and can find a place where you probably won't see much of the race."

I was devastated.

Here I was with three guests, standing in the hot sun with nowhere to sit. I left the group for a few minutes and went for a walk, praying I could figure something out.

As I wandered through the vendor displays and driver merchandise trailers, I came across the Navy Exchange. To my surprise, they had folding chairs for \$20 each.

Problem solved.

I bought the chairs and ended up setting up near the main stage in front of the giant Jumbotron behind the start/finish line. We spent the afternoon watching the race in the shade of the massive electronic leaderboard. Near the end of the race, my father-in-law and I quietly slipped up into the grandstands and watched a few laps before returning to our now-

shaded seats.

I had been hoping for a miracle with reserved seating. In the end, we did have seats—just not the ones we expected!

Well, this is my last PentaGram before AACS.

For me, this is one of the most exciting times of the year because I get to watch our club come together for a common purpose: serving others.

We're hoping to break records this year. Sheri Hendrickson has set the goal at 300 registered cars, and I believe we can get there. I'm also hoping we'll raise \$18,000 for our beneficiaries, STEP—whose efforts Julie has shared with us in this issue (page 3), and Fleet Week.

Events like AACS have always depended on the full participation of our club. One of my favorite sights is watching everyone work together—from the

volunteers directing traffic and guiding cars into their parking spots to the very last person throwing the final trash bag into the trash truck at the end of the day.

Thank you for your incredible spirit of service. It truly sets this club apart. In a time when serving others isn't always the norm, you continue to show what generosity, teamwork, and community look like.

You are a special group of people, and I love being a part of this club.

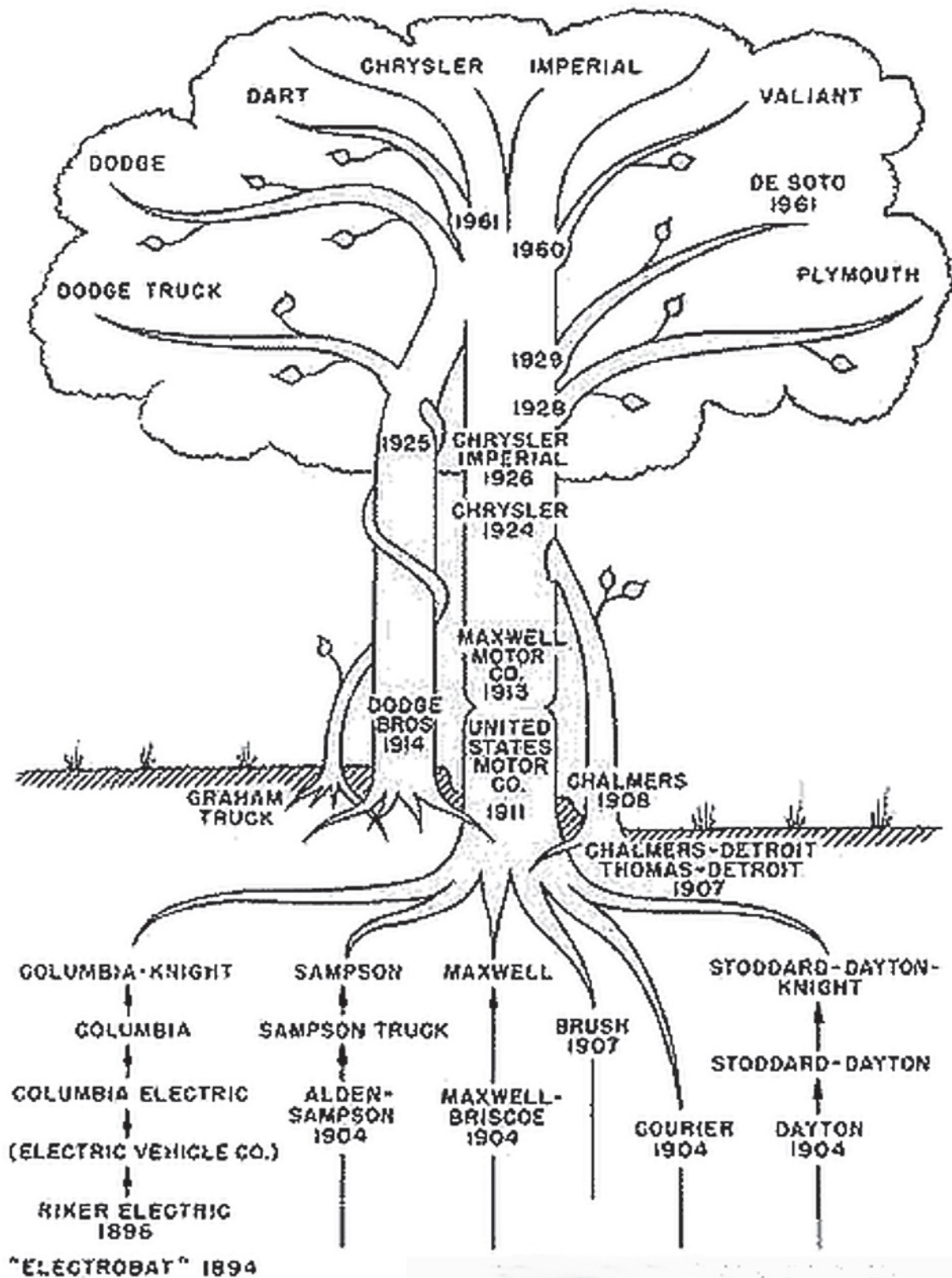
We still need volunteers! We *really* do! We'll have signup boards at our July 8 meeting. Friends, family (teens+) welcome to help.

Anatomy of a Do-It-Yourself Rebuild - Part 3

Jonathan Gbenekama continues the story of his Dodge D100 do-it-yourself rebuild, as of June 21:



My 1971 Dodge D100 Sweptline has been on the road for four weeks now. Over that period, we discovered a couple of easily fix items, loose transmission mount bolt, but more significant, the suspension required 1/2 inch of preload in the front and an inch in the rear. As for changes, we're swapping in 3.91 or 4.10 gear, which should help the truck stay within its power band. The 3.23 gear has us operating outside of its optimum power band.

Additionally, we've gone through and rebuilt/replaced oil cooler and power steering lines. Upcoming schedule has the truck at Westech Performance for dyno tuning. There, they'll optimize/build fuel tables, and more. All preparation is complete and truck is sitting in our garage, awaiting July 14th.

So many details. Truck was completely gutted, to frame. Frame has been boxed, notched, and more. All wiring, fuel systems, brake lines all fabricated new. Sway bars front and rear, along with coil over suspension, quickly raised a red flag. That red flag is, I need sports car bucket seats, so those are on the way, and yes, I will have fully integrated heating and cooling functions.

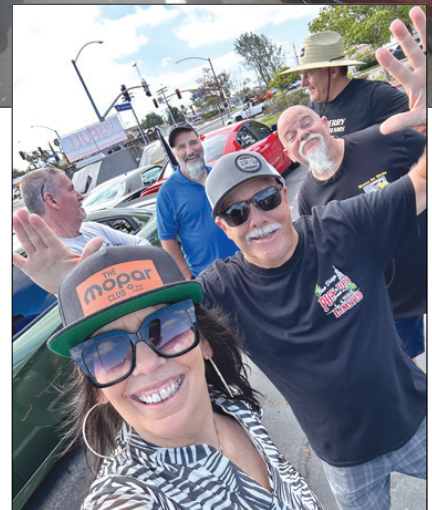

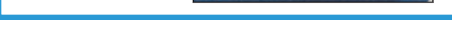
